




#### Detentions Average by year




#### Detentions Arrests by Agency





- Report of an overdose at a residence. The party received 4 doses of Narcan to revive him. He was transported to the hospital and is expected to survive.
- There has been an increase in mail box thefts. Investigative tecniques are being used to identify the suspects.
- Death Investigation: A females body was dumped off the side of the road on Hwy 72 about a mile east of Pinecliffe. The investigation is continuing with several leads being investigated.

- Dispatchers Marie Romero and Chantel Collins did an outstanding job with multiple 911 calls coming into dispatch. One of which was the overdose with a chopper go. There were 3 emergency calls for service that came in at the same time. Marie stated, "This was undoubtably one of the worse scenarios of my career."
- Sergeant Adami received information a man wanted on a felony domestic violence warrant out of Minnesota (involving a gun) was staying at the Coyote Motel. The male said he would die by suicide by cop before going back. A tactical plan was developed. The male was taken into custody without any issues.
- From a Gilpin resident: We would like to send a huge THANK YOU to Deputy Grant Collins and Sergeant Zack Adami for helping us with a situation Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning. They were both very professional and extremely helpful. We truly appreciated their assistance and can't thank them enough.
