
### Detentions Average by year





### Significant Events for October

- Animal Cruelty: An unknown person shot a family cat with a BB Gun. The cat subsequently died from the injury.
- Mental Health Hold: A male got out of his vehicle in the middle of HWY 119 at about MM 3 and started yelling and running into traffic. Deputies were able to secure the male with any injury and placed him on a Mental Health Hold.
- There has been an increase in break-in's into vehicles this month.
- Death Investigation: A females body was dumped off the side of the road on Hwy 72 about a mile east of Pinecliffe. The investigation is continuing with several leads being investigated.

### Citizen Compliments:

- I received an email from a Sergeant with Boulder County Sheriff's Office wishing to thank the assistance they received on a Domestic from Sergeants Anderle and Priest.
- Communication Specialist Shandee Hartvigson received a 911 call from a very hysterical young female. The poor connection from the cell phone made communication difficult. It was determined the female had hit an elk on the Parkway causing significant damage to her vehicle. Shandee was able to give the female clear direction to keep her safe. Shandee was able to calmly talk to the female getting her into a more calm state before deputies arrived. Deputy Joseph Armijo arrived on scene. The RP stated, ". His patient and gentle demeanor calmed the driver and gave her re-assurance that she was safe. The driver later stated that he collected all the information he needed, but it felt like he was just talking to her and he provided an ease which made the interaction comfortable. He remained extremely considerate of her emotions and when the animal needed to be put-down, he pulled her away and made all attempts to distract her."
