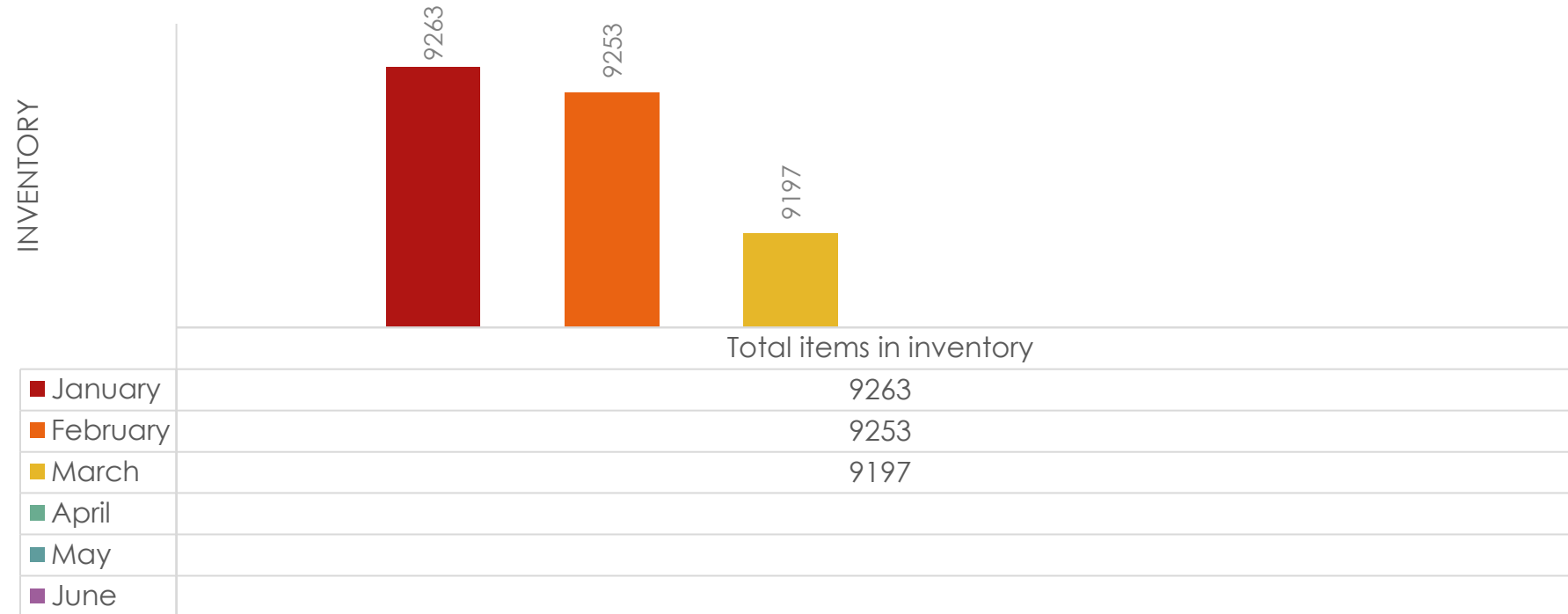

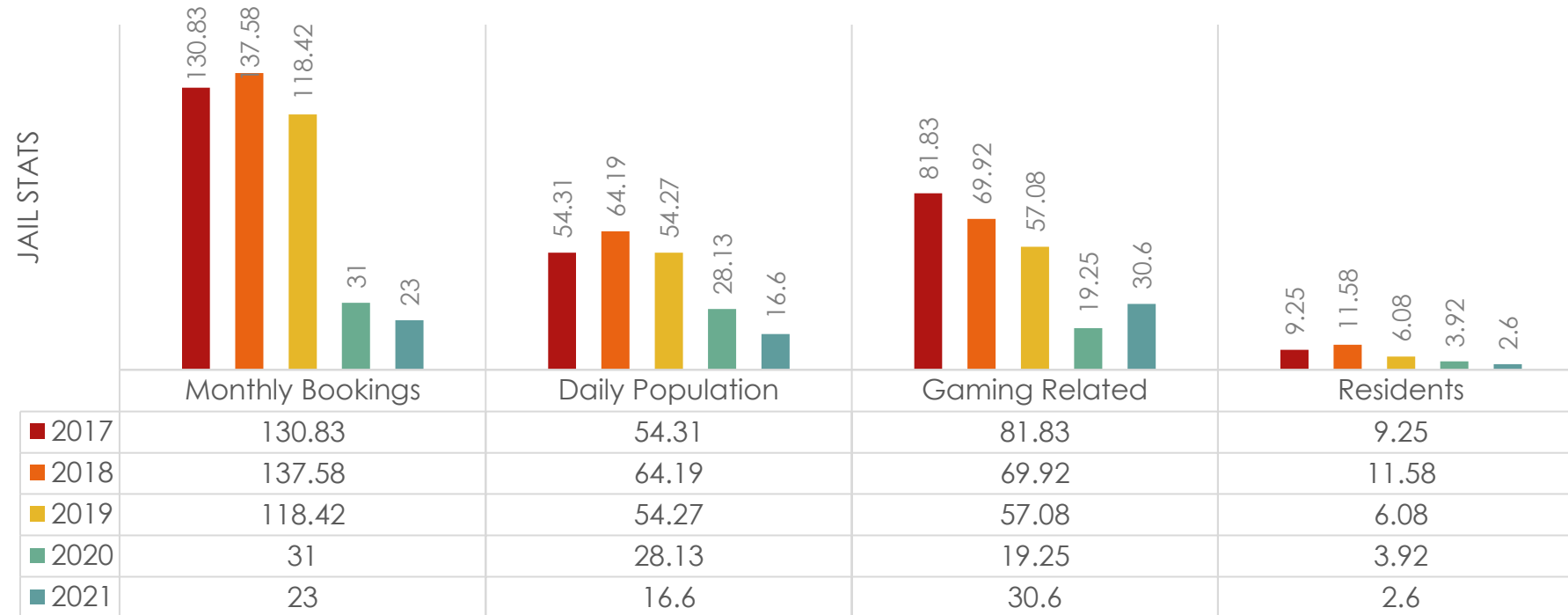

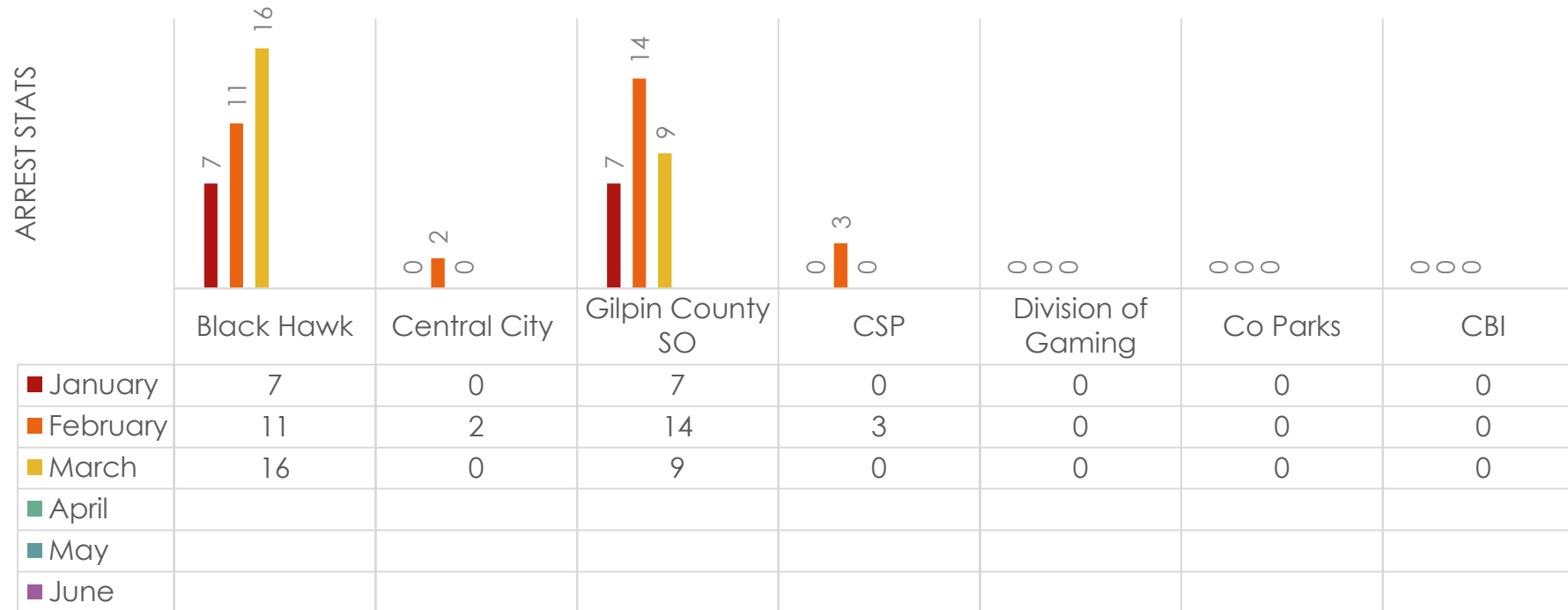
Total Evidence



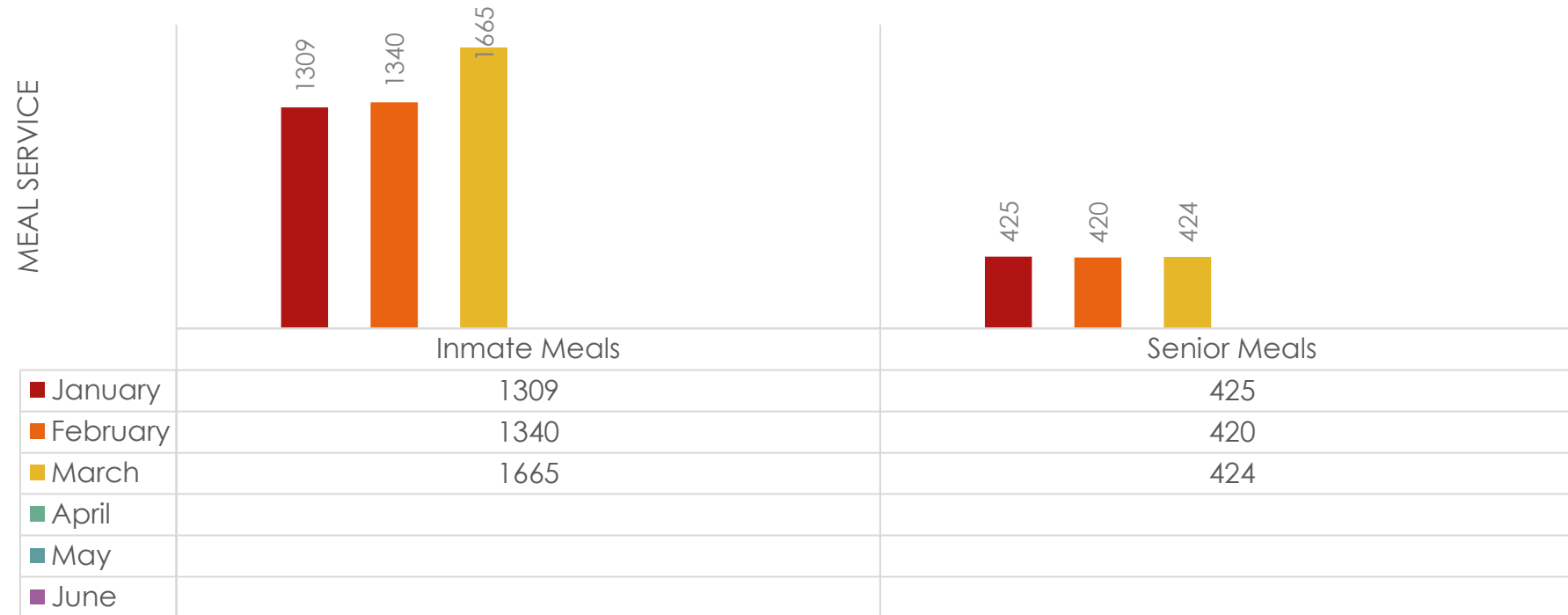
Detentions Average by year



Detentions Arrests by Agency

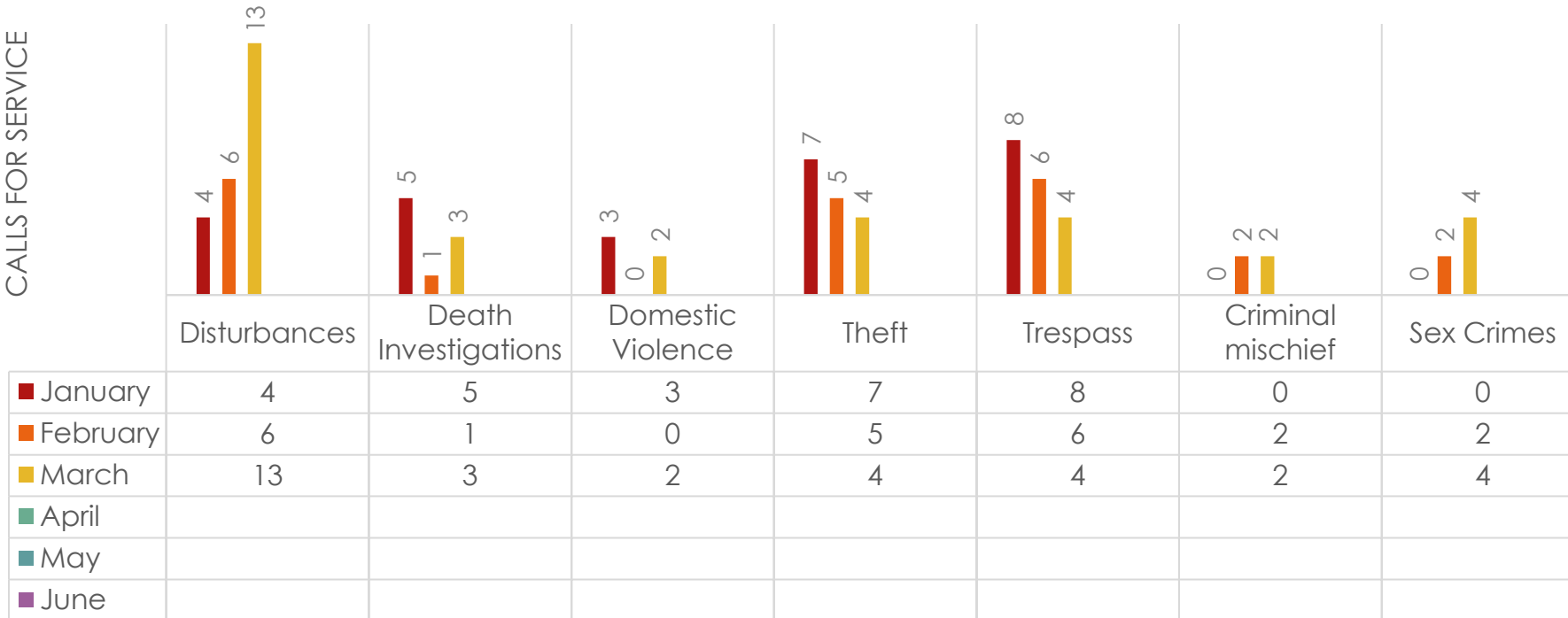


Detentions (Meals)



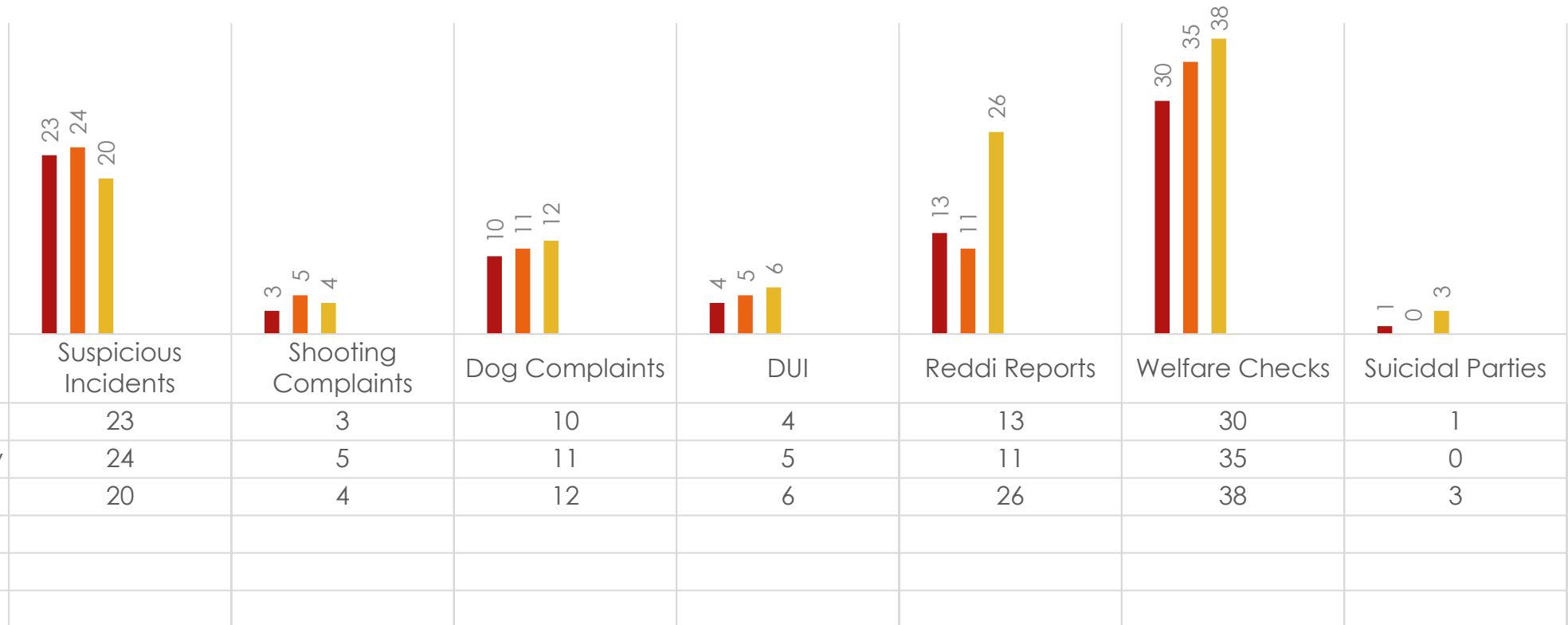

Significant Events for March

- ▶ Overdose: Deputies responded to a parking garage in Central City for an unresponsive Male. It was learned the male ingested OxyContin while drinking alcohol. Narcan was administered at which point he became alert.
- ▶ 3rd Degree Assault: Deputies responded to Roy's Last Shot on an assault. There was a disagreement between two females. One of the females pushed the other. This female was issued a summons and released.
- ▶ Commissioners Hollingsworth, Sill and County Manager Montoya completed their statutorily requirement to tour the jail. Unfortunately Commissioner Isenhart wasn't able to attend.
- ▶ A significant snowstorm dumped up to four feet of snow in some areas of the county.

Citizen Compliments:

- ▶ Deputy Sedlmayr was on his way to work and came upon a head-on collision on Hwy 6 that had just occurred. An impaired driver almost struck a CSP Trooper (who was on another accident) before driving into the wrong lane striking a car head-on. Deputy Sedlmayr placed the couple and their 2 dogs of the victim car in his personal vehicle. He drove them to the Sheriff's Office to arrange for a ride home. Deputy Amie Collins made a reddi report on the errant vehicle and remained on scene of the accident to assist in traffic control and statements.
- ▶ A resident of Central City complimented a deputy who was out in the snowstorm directing traffic for 2½ hours. This kept traffic flowing and moving in the city. The citizen wrote, "It was gratifying and reassuring to me to see such devotion and strong work ethic demonstrated by a deputy."

Citizen Compliments:

- ▶ A great appreciation to Sergeant Wes Jones, Sergeant Keith Priest, Deputy Ghaith Hameed, Deputy David Rak, Deputy Wes Seldmayr, Deputy Stephen Mathews, Communications Specialist Courtney Ray, and Communications Specialist Shandee Hartvigson for staying and sleeping at the Sheriff's Office during the snowstorm so our citizens would not see any break in the services we provided them.
- ▶ A resident sent an email complimenting Deputy Scott Bailey on taking a female from a head-on collision to a safe place so they could get a ride home. She reported, "I was so cold shivering and stressed out and your demeanor calmed me down. You're an exceptional officer."

Citizen Compliments:

- ▶ And from Facebook: A resident reported a ringtail cat behind their pellet stove. They wished to thank the deputy who responded and helped them trap the critter and release it back into the wild.
- ▶ I received an email from Black Hawk Chief Michelle Moriarty thank all our deputies who helped them on March 23rd when they had multiple Domestic Violence calls going on at the same time. She advised hey had 15 calls for service in a 12 hour period. She advised the collaboration between the two law enforcement agencies has never been better.

Sheriff's Office Community Initiatives:

The OEM continues to work with Gilpin County Department of Health on the vaccination program. GCART is manning the phones to assist with the coordination.

The Sheriff's Office in collaboration with Central City, Central City Fire, Black Hawk Fire and Timberline Fire on distributing free CO detectors to residents in Gilpin County.
