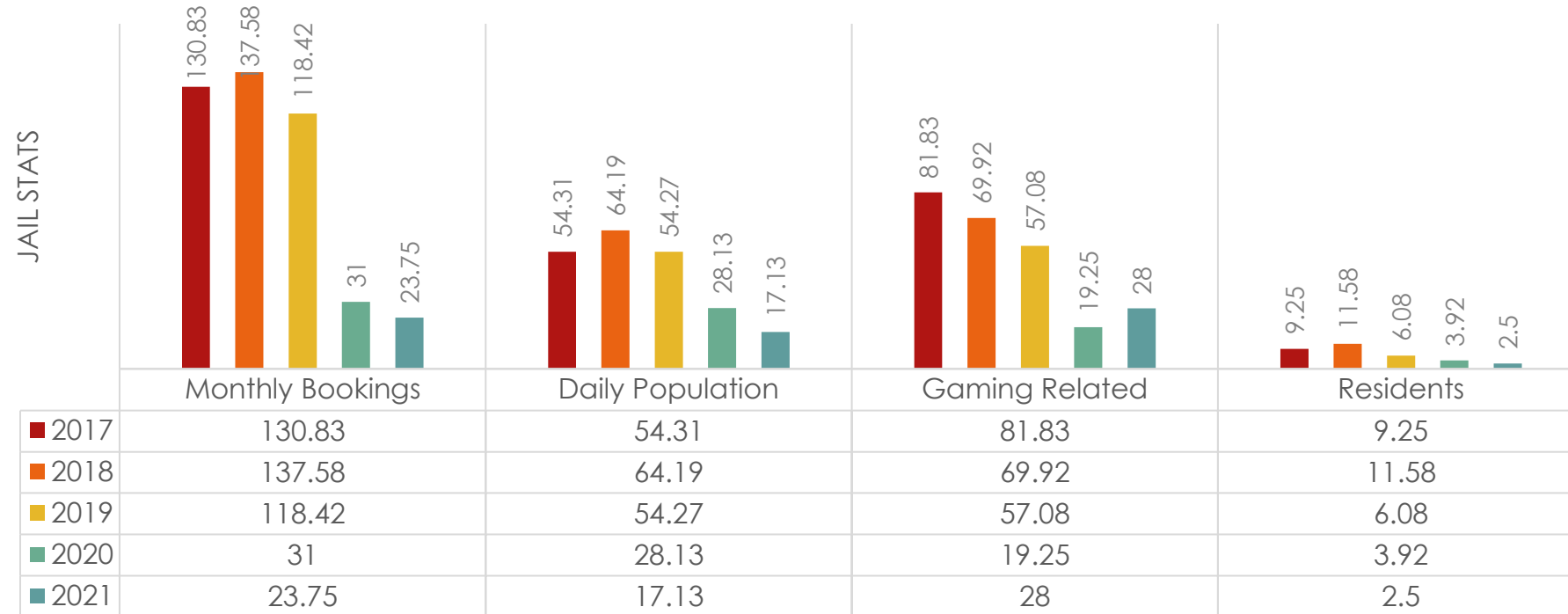

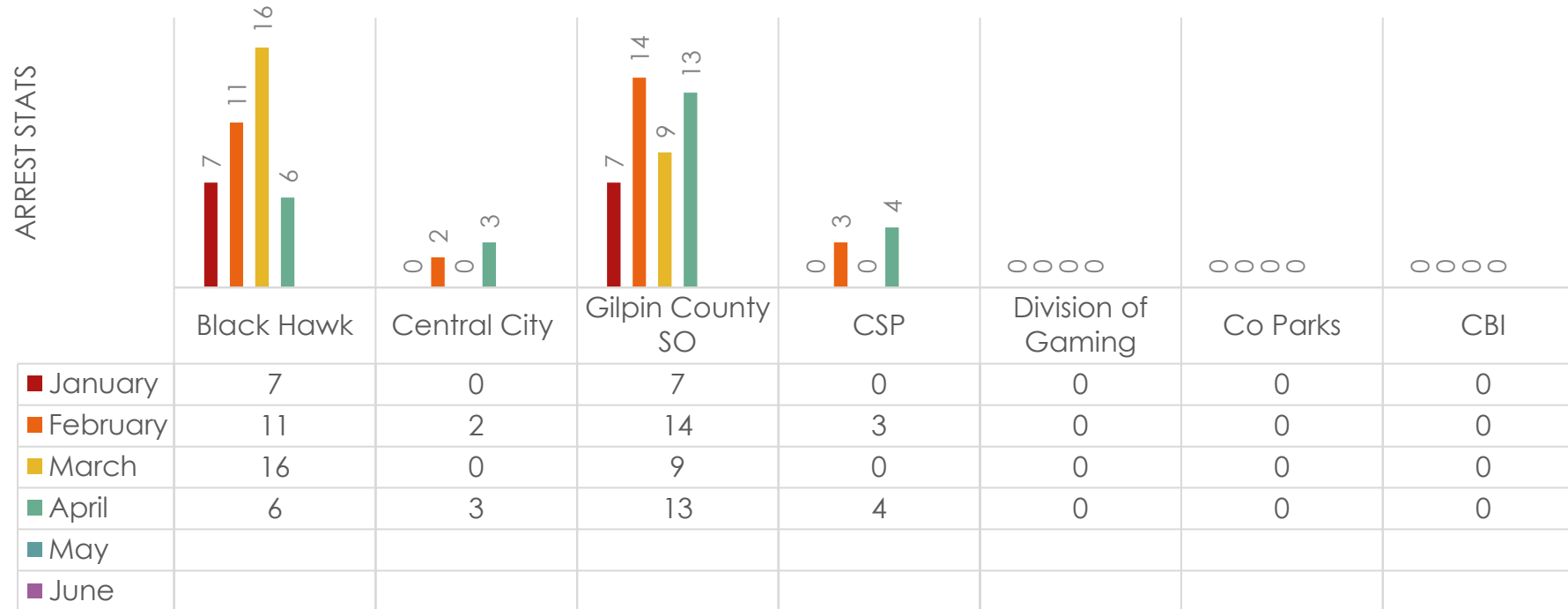




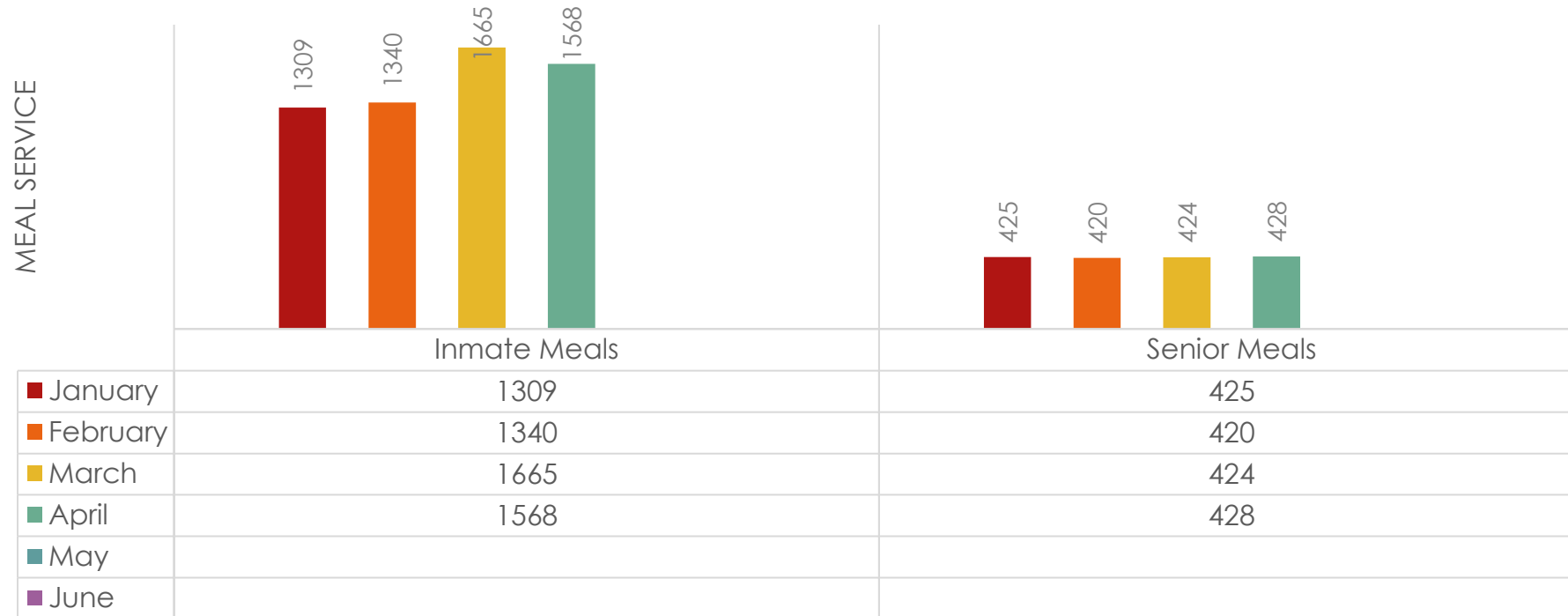
# Detentions Average by year



# Detentions Arrests by Agency

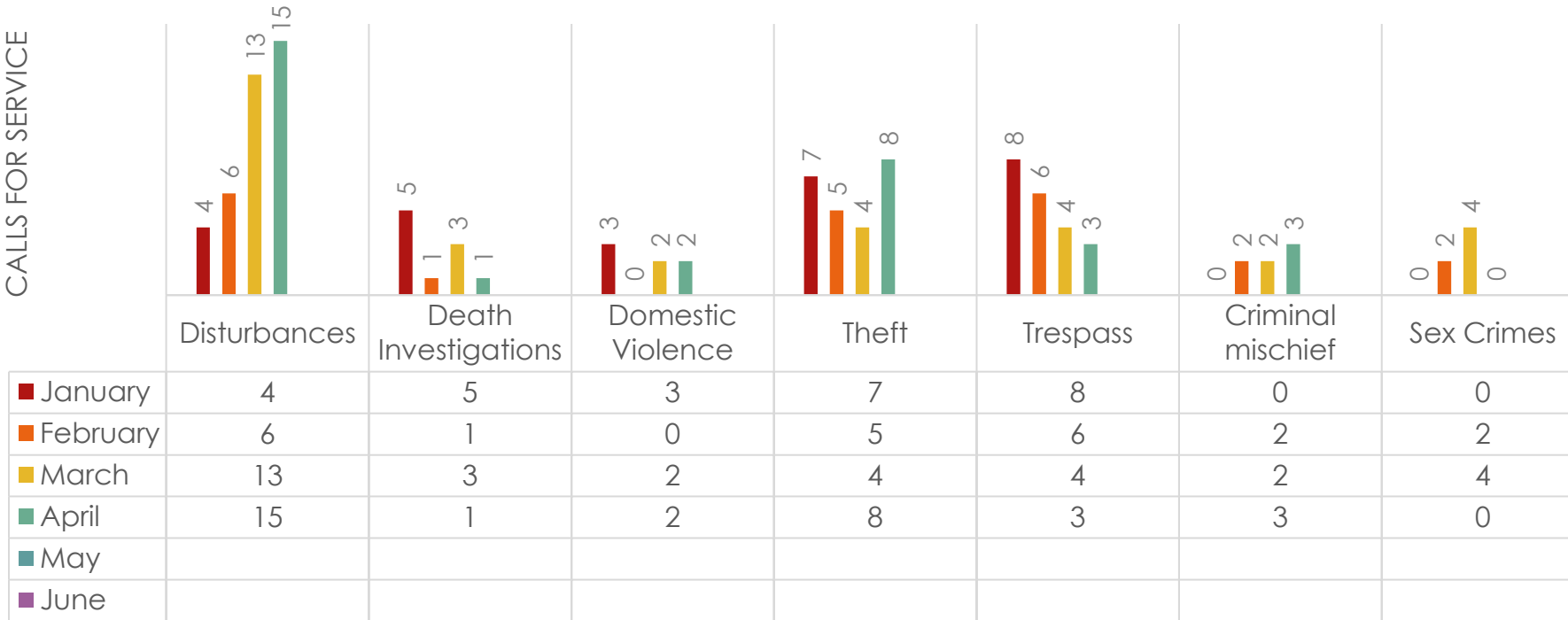

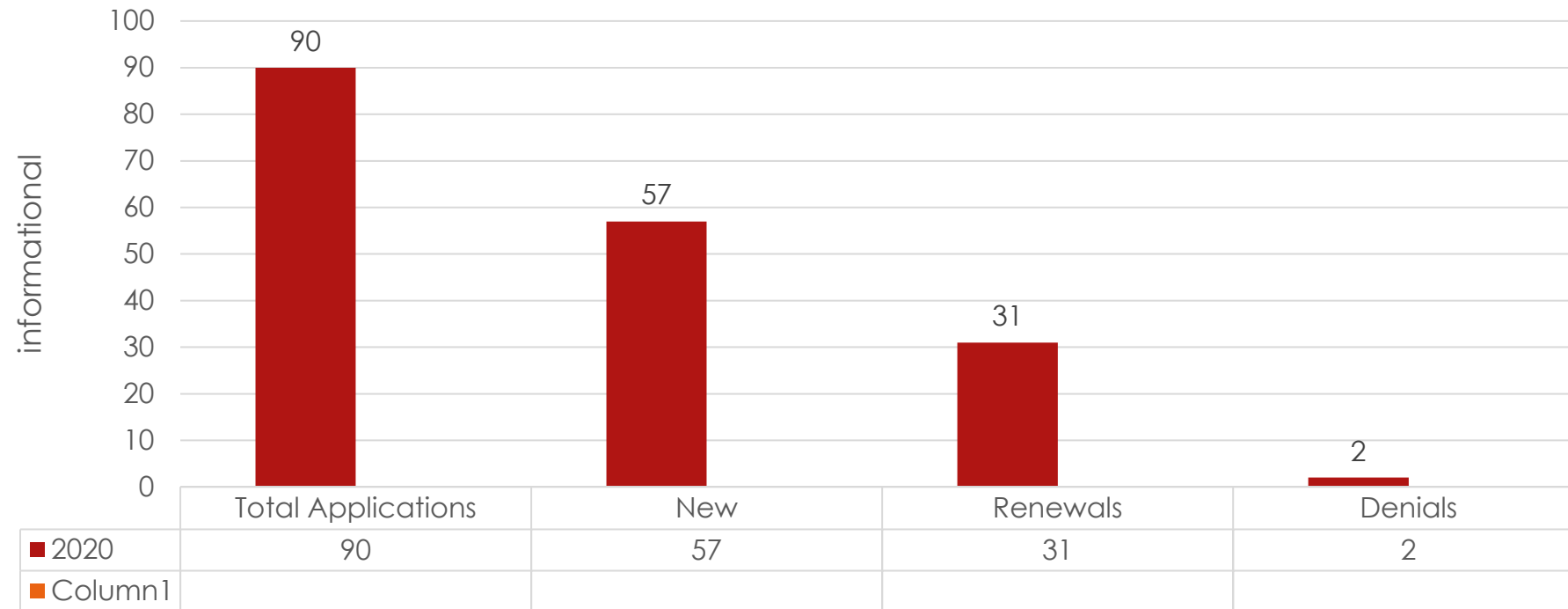
